### Caring Enough to Correct

#### I Corinthians 1:1-10

1. Correction is a normal part of life. Be discreet, but share a time when you have seen or experienced correction done poorly. From your perspective, what led to that?
2. When have you seen or experienced correction done well? What were the things that led to that?
3. This week we talked about the fact that **We Correct Well When We...**

-Are in **RELATIONSHIP**

-Are **SECURE** in our identity (v. 1)

-See other's **POTENTIAL** (vs. 2-3)

-Are **THANKFUL** for others (vs. 4-7)

-**BELIEVE** in others (vs. 8-9)

-Tell others **THE TRUTH** (v. 10)

As followers of Christ, why is it so important that correction be done this way? Spend a few minutes discussing each statement. If appropriate, share personal examples.

4. We also talked about the two extremes of correction – **Avoiding** or **Attacking**. Why is it so hard to “enter the tension” of real conversations about correction? As followers of Christ, how does this lead to personal growth?
5. Finally, we learned even if we disagree with the message of correction or the method of delivery there is often a “nugget of truth” we can receive. As a follower of Christ, why is it important to receive the “nugget”?
6. What are the takeaways from this week's message? How will life be different now that you know these things?
